1. **What is Handshake? Why are we switching from MountaineerTRAK to Handshake?**

Handshake works a lot like LinkedIn, the professional networking site. Students can build profiles highlighting their academic accomplishments, skills and extracurricular activities, and then make those profiles visible to companies on Handshake that have connected with their university. Colleges typically see the number of companies interacting with students double or triple after switching to Handshake.
